members. The committee has prepared the following brief questionaire in order to evaluate and make recommendations to the Directors.

Questionaire:

- 1. Will you, as a member of the Board of Licensure, be able to fulfill the time and economic commitments required by the position?
- 2. What are your views on the eight year ladder bill?
- 3. From the results of past examinations, it would appear that several candidates should not have been admitted to the examination. What would you do to improve the method of evaluating the experience and credentials of candidates for licensure prior to admitting them to the examination?

Duties and Responsibilities of Position:

The State Board for Engineering and Land Surveying, which is appointed by the Board of Regents on recommendation of the Commissioner of Education, assists the Board of Regents and State Education Department on matters of professional licensing and professional conduct. The Board is composed of not less than seven professional engineers and not less than two land surveyors licensed in this state. In June 1977, the law was amended to provide for one public representative to be appointed to the Board.

The major functions of the Board include: (1) participating in the development and selection of the practical examinations in professional engineering and land surveying, (2) acting on matters of professional misconduct, (3) evaluating the grade and character of candidates' experience, and (4) advising the Department on issues facing the profession. The Board meets each month at a time and place determined at the previous meeting. Examinations are held twice each year, in April and November.

Members are appointed by the Board of Regents for five-year terms and may be reappointed for one additional term. Members receive a per diem allowance in addition to normal travel expenses in accordance with departmental policies. The amount of time required by a Board member on board or related activities is approximately four days per month. This includes meetings of the full Board, committee meetings, and professional conduct hearing panels.
