Bill Nettleton presented the Vice President's report. The meeting place for the Board of Directors will be at the Latham Holiday Inn for now.

The chairman of the Membership Committee reported applications from two people: Charles Nacy for Senior Membership, and Kelly Messier for Associate Membership.

The Program Committee Chairman reported that the speaker for the general membership meeting would be Mr. Joseph Magno of Information Integrators of Albany. His topic will be G.I.S.

## Tabled/Old Business:

Notice of tax exemption has been received from the IRS. Applications for the same have been sent to NYS. The final cost for obtaining this exempt status is \$1800.00±. A bill from the accountant in the amount of \$300.00 was presented by Mike Cirillo. A motion was made by Bill Nettleton, Seconded by Steve Walrath to pay the accountant. Motion Passed.

A discussion was held regarding just exactly what our tax exempt status is and what it means. A copy of both the letter from the IRS and the bill from the accountant are attached to these minutes.

Mike Cirillo initiated a discussion concerning having the accountant prepare our 1991 income tax return. The cost for this service would be between \$500 and \$1,000 (This includes the complication of having the extra income from sponsoring the 32nd Annual NYSAPLS Conference.)

At the last NYSAPLS Board of Directors Meeting, Mike Cirillo, treasurer for the 32nd Annual Conference, presented his final report on the 32nd Annual NYSAPLS Conference and a check to NYSAPLS in the amount of \$8000. ENYSLS' share of the conference came to about \$5300. An agreement with NYSAPLS was made to split supply of items left over from the conference last year. The cost to Eastern is about \$1700.

Ellen Nelson reported that she was trying hard to have the new banner for ENYSLS completed in time for the next BOD meeting 12 February. The material initially received was incorrect. The old banner is being cleaned and will be available for the 33rd Annual NYSAPLS Conference.

Tom Nesbitt agreed to investigate upgrading the ENYSLS Handbook to enable copies to be made on both sides of a sheet of paper as well as to be able to have a professional looking interior to the ENYSLS handbook.

Bill Darling presented the Treasurer's Report, which was accepted as read. A copy is attached to these minutes.

Steve Walrath reported on the plans for the Home Show. He met with Bruce Wells, Bob Bartlett and Tom Nesbitt to discuss what to do this year. A photo display of a survey from start to finish will be up, handouts covering what questions a consumer should ask a surveyor, copies of the brochure acquired last year, and copies of the present Code of Practice will be available for distribution to the public. Draft copies of the handouts were passed around and reviewed by and commented on by the BOD. Steve is to assemble a final draft to mail out to the BOD prior to the show for final approval.

Sal Santo reported on the status of the plans for Engineers' Week. The focus will be on "surveyors as a design professional" and will emphasize the need for the surveyor to be involved in a project right from the start.

Sal also reported on his inquiry to OPD regarding its investigatory procedures, specifically with regard to a recent decision in which he was involved. OPD followed the appropriate steps with regard to involving the appropriate professionals to review a complaint.

A discussion on revising the call list for the Wellness Committee was tabled.

## New Business

A letter of resignation from board member Salvatore Santonastaso. It was addressed to the president. A copy of Sal's letter is attached to these minutes. During the discussion of this letter, Mike Cirillo reminded the board that in his position of president, under Roberts' Rules of Order, he has the right to determine what issues are germain to the organization. Mike pointed out that several discussions had occurred between himself and Sal regarding Sal's concern that the OPD may have acted improperly in a recent case that Sal was involved with. Mike also discussed that after reviewing the data given him by Sal, that this case was something that NYSAPLS and ENYSLS should not be involved with. Mike expressed his feeling that he had worked with Sal over the last two years in responding to Sal's many concerns, some of which were about OPD, and that if Sal desired to he was free to discuss this current issue with the individual board members after the regular meeting. Then if the board members felt that this case was an issue that ENYSLS should be involved with, then it would be discussed at the next board meeting(8 January). After further discussion, Sal's resignation was accepted with regret, particularly because it was felt by those involved that there was only a misunderstanding.

A list of actions recently taken by the OPD was circulated. It was noted that a surveyor in Washington County was listed.

A brief discussion about the leftover items from the 32nd Conference was held. It was decided that the sale prices for these items will be rounded down, and that they will be advertised as available to our membership and may be purchased at the next general membership meeting 11 March.

A motion to adjourn the meeting of the Board of Directors was made by Bill Nettleton, Seconded by Bruce Wells, and carried. The meeting was adjourned at 7:40 PM.
